





ETBU confers 160 graduates during Spring 2018 Commencement

East Texas Baptist University held its Spring 2018 Commencement ceremonies on Saturday, May 12 at 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. ETBU President J. Blair Blackburn presided over the ceremony as 138 students received undergraduate degrees and 22 received graduate degrees, for a total of 160 graduates.

"The earning of your degree is a remarkable achievement, but the journey of life-long learning and discovery by the renewing of your minds and transforming of your hearts does not end here," Dr. Blackburn said. "You will commence – you will begin anew – from here to pursue your vocational and spiritual callings for the cause of Christ. As a distinctively Christ-centered University, we are dedicated to producing graduates, who will transform the world by serving and ministering to people with the spirit of Christ in and through them for the glory of God. Our family of faculty, staff, trustees, students, alumni, and you, new graduates, are to be beacons for this generation."

Reverend James Webb gave the keynote address to the graduates of the Schools of Business, Communication and Performing Arts, Education, and Religion at the morning ceremony. Webb is Senior Pastor at Bethesda Missionary Baptist Church in Marshall and also serves as Secretary for the ETBU Board of Trustees. Webb encouraged and motivated the graduates to pursue greatness.

"The true definition of greatness, found in Matthew 23:11, is attainable through servanthood and measured in Christ," Webb shared. "Anyone can be great because everyone can serve. Regardless of the road you take or the delays, discouragements, and disappointments you face along the way, I challenge you to be great as you navigate through the journey of life."

At the service, Chair of the Department of Behavioral Science Laurie Smith was recognized for her excellence in service, scholarship, teaching, and integration of faith and learning with the Professor with Distinction Award. Halee Vasquez, a Bachelor of Arts graduate in Speech Communication, received the President's Award for being the best student representation of a Christian leader, scholar, and servant. Jim Teague ('68), Chief Executive Officer of Enterprise Products, received an Honorary Doctoral Degree in Humanities for his business leadership and service to God and humanity.

The afternoon ceremony speaker, Dr. Danny Reeves, charged the graduates of the Schools of Humanities, Natural and Social Sciences, Nursing, and Professional Studies to press on through adversity. Dr. Reeves, President of Texas Baptists (Baptist General Convention of Texas) and Senior Pastor at First Baptist Church in Corsicana, taught from Numbers 13 with special emphasis on reliance on God's strength.

Our program at ETBU is more than just about fishing but making Fishers of Men and today they showed the love of Jesus at this event," said head coach Cameron Burger.

ETBU started their bass fishing program last year and already has qualified anglers for the national tournaments producing two All-Americans.


