







Women's Basketball Serves in Jamacia

The East Texas Baptist University Women's Basketball Team traveled to Jamaica from Wednesday, August 1 through Wednesday, August 8 as a part of the Tiger Athletic Mission Experience (TAME) program. Led by Head Coach Rusty Rainbolt and ETBU Director of Global Education Lisa Seeley, the group of 27 partnered with Ignite International to minister to the people of Jamaica.

"The coaches prepared the ETBU Women's Basketball Team both physically and spiritually for our time in Jamaica," Dr. Seeley shared. "From the beginning, the team was ready to share the joy of the Lord with the people of this island. These young women are amazing and love God with all of their hearts. It has been a blessing to travel and serve with them."

Founded in 2003, Ignite International is an organization that uses the platform of sports to share the Gospel overseas. With Ignite, the ETBU team competed with international basketball teams, conducted sports clinics for local children, volunteered in schools, and visited orphanages.

"We went to the Melody House for Girls, a home for abused teenage women," ETBU junior Kayla Bise explained. "A few of my teammates shared their testimonies, a powerful experience that created a connection with the girls. Afterward, the women had the opportunity to share their story with us and ask questions. One girl expressed how she knew who Jesus was, but felt like God didn't love her. We had the chance to open the Bible and show her how much God cares for her." Bise continued, "By the end of the conversation, she accepted Jesus into her heart, and at that moment, I thought to myself, 'This is it. This is why we are here.' The whole experience reminded me of Isaiah 61:1-2."

Whether serving at nursing facilities and children's homes, swimming in the ocean, or competing in basketball, the ETBU Women's Basketball Team intentionally sought ways to express and demonstrate Christ's love throughout the trip. The Tigers played at the


University of West Indies against Jamaican Olympic and national team athletes. During half-time, the groups gathered on the court to share testimonies and pray together. Following the games, the teams spent time together in worship and fellowship.

"We were blessed to play with ladies from another country, who we could relate to on and off the court," ETBU senior Valarie Matlock said. "At half-time, we brought the team in the middle of the court and told the crowd about what God does for us. We prayed together and showed them that God is more significant than our ability to play basketball. ETBU won 41-39, but the score was not as important as the fact that we were able to spread the Word of God as a team."

Both the student-athletes and coaches communicated how the seeds they planted will continue to sprout in the lives of the Jamaican people and in their own lives on to the future.

"These staff members and student-athletes have poured their hearts into advancing the Kingdom of God, encouraging the people of Jamaica, and building the team's chemistry," ETBU Women's Basketball Assistant Coach Caleb Henson commented. "Our players have learned not to allow their youth to hinder them as they profess the name of Jesus. They have set an example for all believers with their vulnerability, love, and faith. I believe this experience is going to serve as a foundation for our program as we head into the upcoming season."

The trip to Jamaica was the seventh Tiger Athletic Mission Experience, which provides student-athletes the opportunity to use their God-given talents as a platform to connect with people and share the Gospel of Jesus. Vice President for Athletics Ryan Erwin and Head Coach Alain Savage will be taking the ETBU Hockey team to Austria and Slovakia in early January for the next TAME trip. Get to know Alumna Misty Scott ('97)

Misty Scott ('97) didn't know how or where the Lord was going to use her when she was a student at ETBU. She just knew He would.

"I had friends who knew they were called to be a pastor or a youth pastor, and I spent a lot of years being envious because they knew exactly what God had called them to do," Misty said. "All I knew was I was called to be a minister wherever He placed me."

For the last six years, that place has been Mission Marshall. Serving as the Executive Director, Misty develops programs to strengthen families, empower economic development, and provide reading enhancement in the Marshall community.

"Our work at Mission Marshall is about changing the culture," Misty said. "It's not just about giving someone food or money for an electric bill. It's about understanding where they are coming from and helping them understand a culture that is different so they can be productive in society and not have to depend on systems that are flawed. We are invested for the long haul."

Misty says she knows Mission Marshall is doing its job when she is greeted by guests out in the community.

"People ask me, 'How do you know you are building trust within the community?', and I tell them I know it when I go to Kroger and I have clients running across the parking lot to give me a hug," Misty said. "That is a huge indicator of success to me because it means we

have removed shame from their experience. When you boil it all down, what we do is about building relationships."

Misty, the recipient of the 2018 ETBU Good Samaritan Award, credits her involvement in ETBU Baptist Student Ministry and the influence of University mentors for giving her the confidence to navigate difficult things in ministry.

"The relationships I formed at ETBU are the epitome of iron sharpening iron," Misty said. "We were able to learn from each other and had the freedom to make mistakes and become better because of those mistakes. It was a safe place for all of us to grow as ministers and people."
