## SYLLABUS FOR MINISTRY (MINS) 1127

### Leadership Among Ministry Volunteers

**I. COURSE DESCRIPTION:** a study of leadership in the context of ministry. Attention will be given to the role of volunteer leaders in ministry. Strategies for enlisting and training volunteer leaders will be formulated and analyzed.

- To introduce the student to the basic knowledge, skills and types of assessment needed in a church.
- To introduce the student to the basic types of leaders and their styles and behavioral patterns.
- To introduce the student to basic elements for effective leadership.
- To introduce the student to the requirements and challenges to leadership teamwork.
- To introduce the student to the value of spiritual gifts as discovered in Scripture.
- To instruct the student how to implement a leadership development program.
- To instruct the student how to identify and work with volunteers and church staff that have different leadership styles.
- To help the student develop a plan for discovering, recruiting and evaluating his own leadership style.
- To help the student know how to discover, recruit and train leaders in ministry.
- To equip the student in knowing how to assist ministry leaders in discovering their own spiritual gifts.
