"Do We Practice What We Preach? Have We Become Post-Christian?" This research, presented at the 2017 Southern Sociological Society Annual Meeting in Greenville, SC, was based on a survey of approximately 300 students about their religious beliefs and

how that fit into the Barna Group's definition of what it means to be "post-Christian". A person's level of religion was gauged using 15 metrics related to faith.

In 2016, I was selected to write standardized test question for the ETS Major Fields Test in Sociology. ("The ETS® Major Field Tests are comprehensive undergraduate and MBA outcomes assessments designed to measure the critical knowledge and understanding obtained by students in a major field of study." Source: their website). First we were asked to submit questions. I was then invited to travel to Princeton, New Jersey for an extended weekend with the other writers to finalize the question bank. Strangely, after completing this assignment, I was contacted by ETS and told that the test revision had been postponed for at least a year. They promised to contact me again when funding was available to continue the revisions.

"The Influence of Religious Beliefs on Alcohol and Drug Use at a Small Denominational University". The research indicated that students who ranked higher in evangelical beliefs were less likely to use alcohol and drugs. What was also somewhat surprising was that ETBU has a definite number of students who are classified as problem drinkers. Dr. Laurie Smith and I presented the findings at the SSSA Meeting in San Diego. (2012).
