

General Education Advisor Guide: Fall 2020 & Mini-Terms

Below are suggested options from departments for general education when required classes are not specified for a major. See that the mini term options are noted as well.

Block Tuition & Mini Term Reminders

- **NEW!** Block tuition covers 18 hours in a long semester PLUS any hours in the associated mini terms (add. fees apply). Cost per hour over 18 is \$500 per semester hour. Though tuition for mini terms is included in block tuition. There is now a \$25 fee per mini-term course.
- A student has to be enrolled full-time in the Fall 2020 semester to take August/December/Winter terms as part of the fall block tuition. If the student is not at full-time when the fall semester starts, then tuition will be charged to the student for the August/December/Winter terms.
- January and May Terms are part of the block tuition if they are enrolled full time in Spring 2020.
- If a student wants to take 19 hours during a long term, it must be approved by the Dean and Dr. Sanders. Inform students who enroll in one-week minis that their courses will be open in Canvas 6 days prior and they may have assignments up to 6 days after the course meeting dates to allow them to have additional time to work on out-of-class assignments in a more manageable manner. Encourage them to look in Canvas for the specific due dates.

English All students take ENGL 1301 and 1302 and Sophomore Literature Students may take any 2000 level English to fulfill their literature requirement. Please do not enroll students in ENGL 2341 unless it is required by their major.
