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<p>Block Tuition & Mini Term Reminders</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Block tuition covers 18 hours in a long semester PLUS any hours in the associated mini terms (add. fees apply). Cost per hour over 18 is \$500 per semester hour. Though tuition for mini terms is included in block tuition, there is now a \$25 fee per mini-term course. • A student has to be enrolled full-time in the Fall 2022 semester to take August/December/Winter terms as part of the Fall block tuition. If the student is not full-time when the Fall semester starts, then tuition will be charged to the student for the mini terms. • August, December, and Winter Terms are part of the block tuition if students are enrolled full time in Fall classes. January and May Terms are part of the block tuition if students are enrolled full time in Spring classes. Inform students who enroll in one-week minis that their courses will be open in Canvas 6 days prior and they may have assignments up to 6 days after the course meeting dates to allow them to have additional time to work on out-of-class assignments in a more manageable manner. Encourage them to look in Canvas for the specific due dates. • If a student wants to take 19 hours during a long term, it must be approved by the Dean and Dr. Sanders. 	
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
