

General Education Advisor Guide: Fall 2019 & Mini-Terms

Below are suggested options from departments for general education when required classes are not specified for a major. See that the mini term options are noted as well.

Some Reminders about Mini-Terms as you are registering students:

- A student has to be enrolled full-time in the Fall 2019 semester to take August/December/Winter terms as part of the fall block tuition. If the student is not at full-time when the fall semester starts, then tuition will be charged to the student for the August/December/Winter terms.
- May Terms are part of the block tuition if they are enrolled full time in Spring 2019.
- Remember there is no limit on the number of hours that students can earn in the combination of minis and full terms. However, if a student is looking to take 19 hours during a long term, permission must still be received for that.
- **REMINDER**—Inform students who enroll in one week minis that their courses will be open in Canvas 6 days prior and they may have assignments up to 6 days after the course meeting dates to allow them to have additional time to work on out-of-class assignments in a more manageable manner. Encourage them to look in Canvas for the specific due dates.

Fine Arts:

Be reminded that the Fine Arts gen. ed. requirement is 3 hours and can be met by taking any combination of classes that add up to 3 hours. Students who wish to pursue a Minor in Mathematics should begin with MATH 2401 Calculus I if ready, or take MATH 1425 Precalculus if they need extra preparation to get ready for MATH 2401 within their first year of study.

Students who wish to pursue a Minor in Applied Statistics should begin with MATH 1342 Elementary Statistics and then go on to MATH 2316 Data Analysis early in their program to be able to take the rest of the courses in the minor.

***College Algebra, MATH 1314 moves very quickly, reviewing and expanding on the students' knowledge of high school algebra 2. For a student to be successful, they must be very comfortable with high school algebra 2 or higher and have a **MATH ACT ≥ 20** or **MATH SAT ≥ 480** . Students need to have a graphing calculator.

Please be reminded that **KINE 1238** is the required Physical Activity course for all students in the 2013-14 through current catalogs. One hour activity courses only count as electives for those catalogs (**unless a transfer student brought in a course that was substituted for KINE 1164**).
